# Joint Venture Announcement: Oilmin and P'nyang Holdings Launch PFSL

We are pleased to announce the successful signing of a Joint Venture Agreement between O.M. Holdings Limited (Oilmin) and P'nyang Holdings Limited (PHL)—a company under P'nyang Development Corporation Limited (PDCL)—to formally establish P'nyang Field Services Limited (PFSL).

The agreement was signed on 17 April 2025 in Port Moresby, following more than eight years of collaboration and strategic planning. PFSL has been created to deliver a wide range of integrated field services in the Western Province and surrounding regions. These services will include:

- Camp construction and management
- Certified catering (HACCP and ISO 9001)
- Utility supply (Water and Sewerage Treatment Plants)
- Temporary camp supply
- · Labour hire and workforce management
- Equipment hire and asset management
- Fuel supply and drone support services
- Procurement services and training programs

This joint venture reflects a shared commitment to operational excellence, local capacity building, and sustainable development. PFSL is strategically positioned to support upcoming projects in the P'nyang area while creating employment and training opportunities for local communities.

As part of the company's foundation, five directors from PHL and PDCL completed a week-long Director's Course delivered by Gangloff Consulting and fully funded by Oilmin. The course covered key topics such as corporate governance, legal duties, financial oversight, stakeholder engagement, and strategic leadership—equipping them with the skills needed to guide PFSL with integrity and vision.

The agreement was signed on behalf of PHL by Mr. Kasang Ungale, Mr. Nicky Mark, and Mr. Salfius Willy. Signing for Oilmin were Mr. Peter Aitsi and Mr. Declan Leahy. The ceremony was witnessed by PDCL Chairman Mr. Lee Ila and Oilmin's General Manager Mr. Fintan Lalor.

We congratulate all involved and look forward to the positive impact PFSL will have in the months and years to come.

# Tuberculosis in Papua New Guinea: A public health crisis



**High Burden**: Papua New Guinea (PNG) has one of the highest TB burdens globally, with 42,00-45,00 new cases and around 5,000 deaths annually.

Children at Risk: 26% of TB cases are children, among the highest TB rates worldwide.

**Drug Resistance:** PNG is among the top 30 countries with a multidrug-resistant TB (MDR-TB); incidence in 2022 was a 22 per 1000,000 population. Treatment success is 72%, which is below the global target of 90%.

#### Two Forms of TB:

- 1. **Pulmonary TB:** Affects the lungs and is the most contagious.
- 2. **Extrapulmonary TB**: Incudes Lymph Node TB, TB Meningitis, Spinal TB, Skeletal TB, and Abdominal TB.

**Diagnosis & Technology**: GeneXpert machines have improved early detection and drug resistance testing, enabling timely treatment (6-9 months).

**High Burden Areas**: Daru Island, NCD, Morobe, and WHP.

### TB is airborne- Coughing Transmits Tuberculosis Common signs of pulmonary TB include:

- coughing
- nights sweats
- ·unexplained weight loss

- •well ventilated workplaces and homes
- ·early diagnosis
- correct diagnosis and treatment
- •100% treatment adherence
